There are a number of long weekends during the year. Of importance to note is the weekend of 12 to 16 April. The bi-annual survival camp will be held over the long weekend and scouts are encouraged to keep this long weekend open. The scoutcraft survival and backwoodsman badges will be tested over the weekend. The backwoodsman badge is compulsory for the Springbok Scout Award, and as such scouts over the age of 16 should make a concerted effort to attend the camp or run the risk of not having an opportunity to earn the badge. The scoutcraft survival badge is a pre-requisite for the backwoodsman badge and is designed for younger scouts, so younger scouts will certainly not waste their time by attending the camp.

As always, the gap between private and public school holidays has proved to make planning a year planner that suits all extremely difficult, but you will note that there are weekends off from scouts where you can take a rest from the troop.

As always, patrol camps and hikes may be run which are not shown on this year planner. Each patrol should be running at least 2 day hikes, 2 overnight hikes or camps and 4 patrol activities during the year. Patrol Leaders will provide information as to when these events will occur.

Please also note that we are on camp the first week back at scouts. This camp will be run by Ricardo Peneda and will be part of his Springbok Scout Award. Details will be sent out shortly.

Annual Consent Form

Also attached to this letter is an annual consent form for 2009. This should be filled in and returned as quickly as possible. Please note that scouts who have not returned their annual consent form by the end of January 2009 will not be allowed to partake in scout activities. I would encourage you all to return these forms this year if possible. Families with brothers in them should note that each scout needs his own annual consent form.

80th Celebratory Badges

Campfire badges celebrating the troop's 80th birthday are now available at R20,00 a badge. Please contact either me or Penny Lucas if you would like to order a badge. Unfortunately these badges may not be worn on your uniform but may be put on your campfire blanket etc.

Scout Uniform

Please also remember that a concerted effort is currently underway to ensure uniformity within the Group. By now everyone should have a proper shirt, scarf, woggle, pants and belt. Please note that proper scout socks and black school shoes need to be in place by 23 January 2009, and all pocket contents, including green cards, need to be in place by 20 February 2009. You should also have a look at your camp uniform. Each scout should have at least one 1st Bedfordview golf shirt and a set of black rugby shorts for camps.

Subs

Please remember that the new financial year commenced in October 2008 and that invested scouts should start making arrangements to pay their subs. Roughly two months have already passed and we need to pay our annual capitation to HQ. Invoices and a letter from the committee on how subs are calculated should be sent out with this letter. Visitors to the troop are only liable for subs once they have been invested. Scouts leaving the troop will not be invoiced for the full year.
