Dear scouts and parents

News from the Holidays:

Last week the troop had a hike in the breathtaking scenery of the eastern Free State, close to the Maluti Mountains. Seven scouts braved the icy cold to scale the cliffs and mountains of the Sporekrans Hiking Trail near Fouriesburg.

After a steep climb the scouts were treated to beautiful views of the surrounding countryside. Herds of Hartebeest and Blesbok bounded away as the hikers



approached, deep rock pools on the route would have been verv welcome had the hike been in summer.

At the end of the first day a roaring campfire and ghost stories awaited the tired hikers, who climbed then thankfully into warm sleeping bags.

The next morning the scouts learnt a bit about spoors and tracking at a nearby dam, noting that mountain reedbuck, ostrich, porcupines, zebra and other wildlife had visited the dam in addition to domestic goats, horses, dogs and sheep. After a short



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hike on the Sunday the scouts left for home, memories of the hike stored in their heads, cameras and hike logs.

On the subject of advancement, a number of scouts made full use of the advancement sessions run over the holidays. Every scout who attended a session had at least one item signed off on his advancement, and Raul Giannoccaro managed to complete his Pathfinder advancement badge. Well done!

Please note that during the month of August I will be in Scotland playing in the Edinburgh Military Tattoo and will accordingly be completely out of contact. Northrand District Boot Hike:

Next Friday (30 July) the troop will be competing in the annual Northrand Boot Hike. This year the event will be run in the Tswaing Crater north of Pretoria by the Eastleigh Sea Scouts. Crater is on a fenced off reserve and the boot hike was successfully run there several years ago.

The cost of the event is not yet certain but should be in the region of R50 per person. The event will be run on the Friday evening and scouts can be

We need to ascertain exactly who wants to attend this event in order to arrange transport etc. Further details will be provided as they become available, but I require numbers by no later than 19h00 on Sunday, 25 July 2010.

Younger scouts who are nervous about camping should really consider attending this event. It is only one night away from home and as such it is a good introduction to camping and hiking. Because the event finishes on the Friday you should be able to leave in time to attend any sport commitments that you may have.


Competition Camp:

The Compo Camp scheduled for 13 - 15 August has been postponed due to the non-availability of the Jan Smuts troop scouter, who is running the event. At present the proposed new date is 1 - 3 October, so please pencil this date in. Confirmation of the new date will be provided later in the year. The troop will be running a handyman activity on this weekend instead, details are set out below.

Handyman Weekend:

The patrol dens are in a sorry state and far from being a "home away from home" are in fact an embarrassment.

The committee has allocated some money towards the purchase of paint, doors, window panes and other items to remedy this problem, and the rover crew has volunteered to assist the troop with making the dens a source of pride again.



To this end, on 13 and 14 August 2010 the troop will be running a special programme aimed at fixing up the patrol dens. The troop will be sleeping at the hall and will utilise the Friday evening and Saturday morning to fix up the patrol dens. Scouts who attend this activity will also have items signed off towards their Handyman Badge. Whilst it is unlikely that you will be able to complete the entire badge you will certainly be able to make good progress towards it. The Handyman Badge counts as an Explorer Interest Badge.

There will be no cost for the weekend but you will need to provide your own food. Fathers who would like to lend a hand should contact Mark Brown and let him know. Please remember though that this is about scouts fixing the dens assisted by rovers and fathers, not scouts sitting and watching while fathers and rovers do all the work.

This activity is very important and I would ask every scout to attend. It is not fair that some of you will benefit from the labour of others whilst contributing nothing yourself.

Soccer Competition:

The 3rd Kensington Sea Scout Troop will be running a 6-a-side soccer day on 15 August 2010 at the Edenvale Sports Centre. The entry fee is R140,00 per team and a number of scouts have expressed an interest in taking part.
