# **Competitions**

# Cooking Competition:

On Friday 8 October 2010 the Northrand District Cooking Competition will be taking

place at our hall in the place of the normal scout meeting. It is our hope that all four patrols will be able to enter this event and have a great deal of fun in the process.



# Pioneering Competition:

From 08h30 Saturday 9 October to 14h00 on Sunday 10 October the Pioneering Competition will take place at our hall. Due to equipment constraints we will not be able to enter multiple patrols as for the cooking competition. We will probably be



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entering one composite patrol of ten scouts. It would be appreciated if you could advise whether or not you will be available on that weekend to take part in the pioneering competition so that a team can be selected. We will then provide full details of the competition to the scouts that will be representing the troop.

There will be a campfire at 20h30 on the Saturday evening which all scouts and parents are welcome to attend irrespective of whether or not you are part of the competition team. Please bring your own chairs if you do decide to pop around.

#### Boot Hike:

On the evening of Saturday 30 October the Northrand District Boot Hike will be taking place at Tswaing Crater north of Pretoria. Patrols are meeting at the crater at 19h00 so you will need to be available from about 16h30. The event finishes at 06h00 on the Sunday morning and you will probably be back in Bedfordview by about 09h00. Entry fee will be an estimated R50,00 per person, which will cover the fee to use the nature reserve. This does not include food or transport to the event.

The patrol leaders would like to put together a good showing for this event too, so please again indicate whether you will be available to be selected to represent the troop at this competition.

A boot hike, for those new to scouting, comprises of a series of bases designed to test scouting skills. Patrols navigate and hike between the bases, attempting to score as many points as possible at each base. It is a great deal of fun and is a great way to get to meet other scouts in the district. The Tswaing crater is an ideal site for this sort of event, in addition to being on a fenced-off nature reserve, the meteor crater makes this an interesting site which the scouts are sure to remember!
