The hike will be run on 27 May 2011 and will probably take place at SAHETI School in Bedfordview.

Patrol Camps:

All four patrols recently went on patrol hikes. Kudu and Wildebeest explored the Vredefort Dome, Sable went to Suikerbosrand and Springbok braved inclement weather to conquer the Suikerboschfontein Hiking Trail near Carolina.

Early in June the patrols will once again be off on their own as they embark on patrol camps. Please keep the weekend of 10 - 12 June open as it is very important that the PLs run successful patrol camps as part of the run-up to the World Jamboree.

Events in the More Distant Future:

It is never too early to start preparing for the future, and two exciting events are on the distant horizon which you may want to consider.

Firstly there is a troop holiday scheduled for 9 - 13 December 2011. These dates are subject to change, but I would appreciate input from all the scouts in order to ensure an event which can be enjoyed by all, with the maximum attendance possible.



The Court of Honour has requested a trip to Durban. There is a scout campsite in Morningside in Durban and I would like to make a booking as quickly as possible if there is sufficient interest.

Should a trip to Durban not be possible, the Court of Honour has requested a trip to Mafikeng, the birthplace of scouting. A scout centre has been built in the town and an adjacent game farm allows scouts the opportunity to track game such as rhinoceros with professional trackers.

Preparing to take on Kengray in the finale of the Challenge

The biggest factor of the trip will be cost and a five day trip will probably cost in the region of R700,00 per scout. Prices are obviously vary according to the petrol price and the number of scouts attending, but hopefully this will allow parents to have a rough idea of what the trip will cost. At the end of this letter is a reply form which should be returned by no later than 27 May 2011. The format and dates of the trip will be determined according to your responses on this form, so please respond promptly.

The second event is scheduled for December 2012. Every two years the Senior Scout Adventure is run in the Cedarberg Mountains for eleven days. This event is only open to scouts who are 15 and older and who hold the Adventurer Advancement Badge. Man-sized activities like parasailing, abseiling, flying, paintballing, skeet-shooting and 4 x 4ing are only part of the biggest scout adventure in South Africa.

Several scouts in the troop will be of the right age to attend, but currently lack the advancement to go on this exciting adventure. If you are keen on attending please let me know so that we can start working on your advancement to get you up to speed.
