Fundraiser for Ant Hoines:

AGM:

A while ago you were told about the horrible accident that Bedfordview rover Anthony Hoines was involved in. Since then a great deal has happened. Ant has just left ICU after spending several months there on a ventilator. He is now able to talk and remains up-beat, an excellent example of "a scout smiles and whistles under all difficulties". Although his diagnosis as a C5 quadriplegic has been confirmed, Ant has taken the proverbial bull by the horns and is undergoing rigorous physiotherapy to

enable him to use an electronic wheelchair, which will give him a great deal of freedom. His progress since being placed in a recovery ward in the Meulmed hospital has been remarkable and Ant has now been allowed a couple of visits home.

A fund has been set up to assist Anthony. As you can imagine a great deal of specialised equipment has to be purchased to allow him to perform tasks that we take for granted. The fund will be raffling off a helicopter flight over Joburg to help raise funds to assist with this.

Scouts who want to should chat to me about selling raffle sheets on behalf of the fund. Scouts are under no obligation to do this. This is not a troop fundraiser and nobody will think any the worse of anyone who does not want to take part. I do think though that it



would be a great gesture for everyone to try their best to sell some tickets for an excellent cause.

Anthony has repeatedly given of himself to the troop over the years, and he has become a familiar face at scout competitions and boot hikes. It would be really nice for the troop to do something in return, and this is a relatively simple thing that everyone can do that could make a big difference.

Troop Holiday:

The troop holiday has been confirmed for 9 to 13 December 2011. I have been in contact with the BP Island Campsite in Durban and the basic planning for this event is well underway. In order to facilitate planning, it is imperative that scouts make a final commitment to this event now. The cost of the event is R750,00 per person. This will not cover the entire cost of the camp and some fundraising is going to have to be done. In order to plan this properly, we need to know who will be attending.

Could everyone please complete the reply slip at the end of this letter and return it by no later than 7 October 2011. Email replies are also fine. Male friends of scout-going age may attend this camp if there is place, but places will be allocated to members of the troop first.

The Air Force will be putting on an awesome air show at Waterkloof in Pretoria on 1 October 2011 from 08h00 to 17h00. Cost is R50,00 for adults and R20,00 for children. - Toiletries (soap, sponge, facecloth, deodorant, toothbrush, toothpaste, floss etc
- Sun cream and insect repellent

- Plastic bags for litter / laundry
- Any personal medication
- Duly completed consent form and health certificate with R180,00
