Assistant Troop Scouter Needed:

It is impossible for someone to replace Mark but it is important for the troop that we find someone to succeed him in his position as ATS. If you have a father, uncle or friend who enjoys the outdoors, working with youngsters and giving back to the community please have a chat to him to see if he is interested in joining the scouter team at Bedfordview.

Although a scouting background is of course useful it is certainly not a prerequisite for the job. Enthusiasm and a willingness to learn more than make up for any skills shortage, and SASA has an extensive series of training courses available which will soon provide even a novice with a range of scouting skills.

Applicants should be older than eighteen, be willing to abide by SASA's rules and regulations and will have to submit themselves to a background check to ensure that they are of a suitable character to work with the youth. A prospective ATS will need to complete three short training courses over the next year or so, which will then allow the issue of the ATS warrant.

Prospective applicants are more than welcome to contact me to find out a bit more about the position and what it entails. It is hard work, but it is also incredibly rewarding and allows you access to a range of activities which most people only dream about. Mark, for instance, has attended three World Scout Jamborees and five Cederberg Adventures. He has also helped shape many young people's lives, which in itself is a fantastic reward for the time that he has given to the movement.

A good ATS is an invaluable asset to any troop and can only help to build the troop and ensure that the scouts attending the troop get the best scouting experience possible.

Trip to the Cricket:
