The closing date for entries for the World Scout Jamboree has been extended to 30 April 2018. This Jamboree promises to be the adventure of a lifetime and I would encourage all scouts who can afford this to give serious consideration to attending. If you missed the information session run at our hall, please feel free to ask me any questions that you may have about this event and I will endeavour to assist you.

rather than later to ensure that the necessary approval is obtained timelessly. This will also assist the organisers with planning and keeping the cost of the Jamboree to a

## **Cell phones at scouts**

It has been brought to my attention that a number of scouts, and particularly older scouts, have been bringing cell phones to troop meetings. Kindly note that cell phones are not welcome at scouts and should be left at home. The same holds true for cell phones on camp.

On occasion an exception to this rule will be made where safety concerns warrant the use of cell phones (for example on hikes with scouters will not be present). These exceptions are generally only made for Patrol Leaders. On these rare occasions Patrol Leaders will be advised that they may bring cell phones to scouts before the event.

Patrol leaders may not bring cell phones to scouts as a matter of course though and, save for these exceptions, the ban on cell phones applies to them as well. Your anticipated cooperation with this rule is appreciated.
